



AUTOANTIBODY GUIDE

The screening test looks for up to 5 different diabetes-related autoantibodies in the blood. If the test spots 2 or more of them before symptoms, that means you are in the early stages of T1D.

Show this card to your doctor to talk about the 5 diabetes-related autoantibodies.

Type 1 diabetes autoantibodies

Descriptions
Glutamic acid decarboxylase 65 (GAD) autoantibodies
Insulinoma-associated antigen 2 autoantibody (IA-2)*
Zinc transporter 8 autoantibody (ZnT8A)
Islet cell autoantibody (ICA)
Insulin autoantibody (IAA)

*Did You Know

In the latest American Diabetes Association (ADA) Standards of Care, it’s been identified one autoantibody in particular, IA-2, is an independent risk factor for progression. Individuals with test results that report a single IA-2 positivity should be monitored similarly to individuals with multiple T1D-related autoantibodies.
